Dear SJV Parishioners,

I would like to update you on some changes that are happening within our health care system. I received a call from Chaplain Brian Baker, Director of Chaplain Services at Arnot Health in Elmira. Chaplain Brian asked me to come back to celebrating Mass at Taylor Health. I am happy to return to my monthly Mass for the residents of that nursing care facility. I know they have missed me, and I have also missed being with them every month. The COVID Pandemic has brought us more distancing and isolation than ever before. Our spirituality has also suffered. We have been blessed to come to church each week during this long scourge, but those in Rehab and nursing homes have not been able to come together in groups to practice their faith. I am so pleased to be invited back for them. I will be talking to Amanda in the activities office at Taylor to get me back on the schedule, so that volunteers can assist with getting residents to Mass when I resume my ministry there. I am hoping to start at the end of July. It is a blessing that things are starting to open up for some type of routine and normalcy again. I do have to comply with NYS requirements before entering Taylor. I am vaccinated for COVID, and the VA Hospital swabs me twice a week. I shall follow protocols so that the residents can practice their religion again and return to worship on-site.

This brings me to another need. We had Eucharistic Ministers before the pandemic and then restrictions made it impossible for them to minister. Now that things are loosening up, I need to invite those Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers to please come back! We need YOU at Masses here at SJV Parish, and I will need YOU to help at Arnot Taylor Health again. First, if you have the time and can help, you will need to sign up as a volunteer. Once a week Arnot is requesting the Eucharistic Ministers to visit. However, you will need to fill out some paperwork, such as showing that you have had the MMR vaccinations for Mumps, Measles, and Rubella, as well as a TB test. You also need to have had a COVID vaccination, or to get one. Then a little orientation to make sure you are keeping yourself and the residents safe, using other protocols such as hand sanitization after each room visit. An ID as a volunteer will be given to you, to go into the facility to minister without any problem. These are procedures for New York State.

I asked if visitors with family and friends can come to this monthly Mass at the nursing home. The answer is No. We **cannot have visitors going into residents' rooms. No guests at Mass yet.** However, if you go through this process of becoming a volunteer, you are able to come to Mass once a month with your loved one. Otherwise, folks need to make an appointment with the facility and nurse in order to visit someone there. In the past, the residents enjoyed seeing parishioners and having folks they remember coming to Mass with them. Socialization and parish activities, even in the health care facility, are so important to them.

Thank you for reading this and being updated. I hope and pray that some will respond to this by calling the Parish Office, so we can get ministers back each week to those who could benefit from your ministry and visit.
