Mark 16: 2-6" Very early when the sun had risen, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb. They were saying to one another, 'Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?' When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back; it was very large. On entering the tomb they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a white robe, and they were utterly amazed. He said to them, 'Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Behold the place where they laid him."

Our annual St. John Vianney Rummage Sale is coming soon! Now is the clean out and declutter...


St. John Vianney's Rummage Sale will be Friday, May 16th and Saturday, May 17th
