



Sit toward the front where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear what's going on at the altar. They tire of seeing the backs of other's heads. Quietly explain the parts of the Mass and actions of the priest, altar servers, choir, etc. Sing the hymns, pray and voice the responses. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.

Let them know that they are at home in this house of worship.



Companions on the Journey



Novenas are a focused way of praying, often for nine days in a row. Give one a try!






