Bring your **Bag of Kindness** back to Mass and place it in the basket to be brought up during the Preparation of the Gifts, since all your kind deeds are indeed Gifts to God. Jesus' manger will be filled with your KINDNESSES. What a soft and precious place!



1ST WFFK of ADVENT- HOPE

Advent emphasizes **KINDNESS** to prepare for Christ's birth by imitating Jesus' love and service to others. Small acts of KINDNESS serve as a reminder that the season is not meant to be

commercialized about buying presents, but about spreading joy and warmth to others.
