WERE YOU THERE...as a Demonstrator?

Luke 19:38 "They proclaimed:

'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord.

Peace in heaven

And glory in the highest.'

While crowds cheered Jesus as he entered Jerusalem, not everyone in the city shared this enthusiasm. The religious leaders like the Pharisees, were wary of Jesus and his growing popularity.

REFLECTION:

"It is easy to speak about the plight of the homeless, the unfairness and injustice of prejudice, the suffering of the ill and abandoned, or talk about faith among a few friends. But when Jesus calls us to put our words of faith into action and visible witness to the world, are we, too, tempted to vanish amid the crowd to later betray Him, fearing what others think if we continue to follow? Is our faith only on our lips in places or situations where it is comfortable, safe, or politically correct? All of these questions arise from Palm Sunday when Jesus asks us all: WHAT IS YOUR REASON FOR BEING PART OF THE CROWD? Are we simply curious sightseers, fair-weather followers, complainers, or grace-filled, forgiving, serving disciples of our crucified Lord?"
