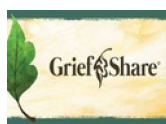

While the presence of a diagnosed mental health condition may be a contributing factor to an increased risk of suicide, it is important to know that a majority of those who live with a mental health condition will NOT die by suicide. Through treatment and self-care, most people have learned how to manage their condition just as they would any other health issue. Becoming familiar with your own mental health and knowing how to manage it effectively will allow you to live a fuller life.

Taking care of your overall health will often improve your mental health- eating a healthy diet full of fruits, vegetables, and proteins, getting good sleep, exercising regularly, spending time outdoors, connecting with family and friends, volunteering to help others, journaling, and doing things you enjoy most, like gardening, sewing, or building projects, are some examples.

Taking care of yourself matters and is a positive step in maintaining good mental health.

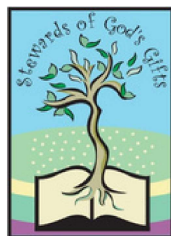
