Women's Silent Day of Reflection



Dear friends in Christ,

Looking at my calendar now, I have already finished the first 100 days here at St. John Vianney Parish. So far, I have not heard any phone call from the bishop yet. It is good news. In the month of October, our daily mass schedule will take place in the morning in order to keep the attendants safe on the road due to the colder season.

The Holy Hour will take place at 10:30am and daily mass will follow at 11:30 am. I hope that whenever the rectory floor is repaired and cleaned up, we will be able to gather for a fellowship lunch after a daily mass, tentatively on Thursday. At the same time, I will begin my pastoral visitation to the homebound and the sick. Please help me to fulfill my priestly vocation as a shepherd of the parish. If you know someone in your family, in your neighborhood or a friend in a parish whom you have not seen at church because of illness or being homebound, or those who are living in a nursing home, please let Shelly know. Eucharistic ministers, if you are visiting someone regularly, please also inform Shelly. She is putting together a list of the homebound in our parish so that I am able to visit soon.

In terms of liturgical practice, we are restoring some practices that were dismissed during the pandemic. At weekend masses, gifts and collections will be brought up to the altar during the Presentation of Gifts. Flamed candles are also placed on the altar at two churches. We are grateful that Deacon Bob is now leading the Buildings and Grounds Committee. For the last two weekends, he has invited some of you to serve on the committee. Thanks to our Maintenance Staff and volunteers, especially those from the Knights of Columbus, six tons of junks from our campus were removed shortly before Bishop Matano came to celebrate the feast of St. John Vianney. Members of the Knights have been so dedicated to our ongoing repairs and costs. They donated a new gas stove, a new kitchen sink, and a new dishwasher to our rectory.

Before my arrival, our Strategic Planning Group and Finance Council already prepared for a major project that seeks to repair the interior parts of St. Mary and St. Gabriel. We are still screening different options and their costs. These repairs were initiated based on a result of the diocesan safety inspection. The crack on the ceiling at St. Gabriel's and structure of St. Mary's sanctuary are the high risks items.

Some of you noticed that our campus is now looking so clear and empty because the old bushes were removed just in time before they cause any further damage to the foundation of the house. During this fall, we will start a perennial garden which is dedicated in thanksgiving to the founding members of our parish. We hope to plant the Spring Bulbs by November 15. We accept your donation of Spring bulbs now and in May 2026, we will have another campaign to collect perennials plants. Then we will have a complete garden with flowers blooming from March all the way to November each year.

Let us continue to thank God for all His blessings upon our faith community.

Quietly explain the parts of the Mass and actions of the priest, altar servers, choir, etc. Sing the hymns, pray and voice the responses. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.


