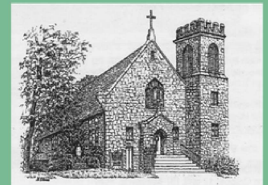

National Suicide Prevention Month

National Suicide Prevention Month in America
and September 10th, World Suicide Prevention

Day serve as reminders that there are steps
we can all take to care for our family, friends,
community, and those impacted by
this leading cause of death.

Recognizing that someone may be struggling
with their mental health can be challenging.

Suicidal intentions aren't always obvious,
especially among those who attempt to keep
them hidden. However, here are a few common
signs and becoming familiar with them, can
help identify a loved one who may be at risk:

- * Expressing feelings of unbearable pain or self-harm
- * Withdrawing from friends, family, and activities
 - * Giving away treasured items
- * Drastic changes in sleeping behavior, eating habits,
or substance abuse
 - * Experiencing extreme mood swings or reckless
behavior
 - * Neglecting personal hygiene

It is impossible to know what is going on in
another person's head. But if you do notice an
unusual behavior and suspect that a loved one
may be struggling, you should ask if they are
contemplating self-harm. Reaching out could save
a life. Research has shown that asking someone
whether they are contemplating suicide, will NOT
"put the idea in their head" if it wasn't already
there. Suicide is preventable and
mental illnesses are treatable.

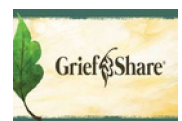

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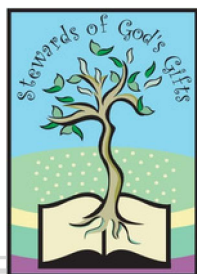
