Weekly Church Announcements

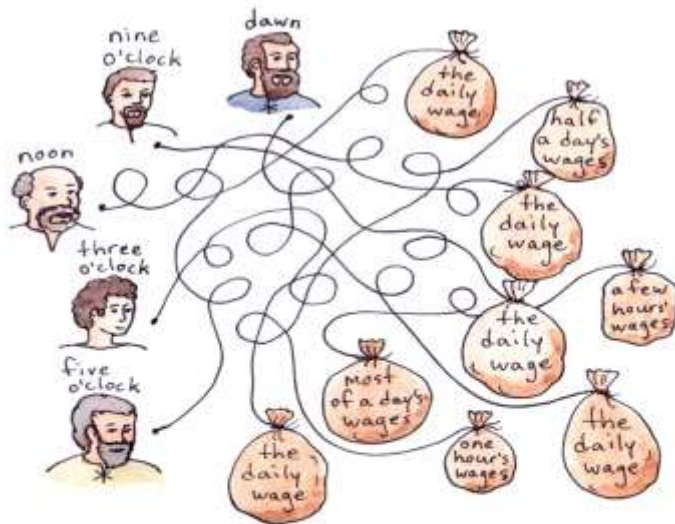


The way we talk about suicide matters. The topic of suicide should always be approached with care and compassion, using sensitive, non-judgmental language. Avoid using the term 'committed suicide'. This implies a sin, a criminal offence or act and it can be

stigmatizing to the person who has passed away and the people who are bereaved. Instead use 'died by suicide', 'death by suicide', or 'took their own life'.

There are many ways to Be the Light for others. Several St. John Vianney parishioners have participated in an event on the first Saturday of May at Eldridge Park in Elmira. The Walk a Mile in Their Shoes event will celebrate their 17th year in 2024. Its main purpose is to raise awareness of programs available to prevent suicides, promote positive mental health, and show support for those who are vulnerable. It is free to participate but donations are greatly appreciated. Our team, "Michael's Hope" has joined hundreds of others since 2019. This event will be held at St. Mary's in Bath, under the shade tree in the front yard of the school or in the pavilion in case of inclement weather. You may bring a lawn chair if you wish.
