R. My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

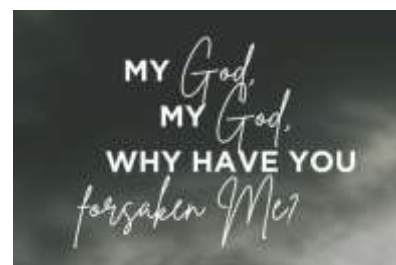
They divide my garments among them, and for my vesture they cast lots.

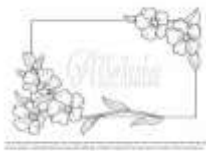
