Diocesan Updates on COVID-19

The Diocese of Rochester has answered some questions that I have asked. These are questions that many of you have asked me and I am sharing this information so that we are all on the same page.

Question #1 - Can we have singing in Church? The answer is Yes, but it is limited because we still have precautions in place. If there an organist, who is usually above the congregation, they can play the organ and can sing solo. As long as no one is within six feet of them, they can play and sing. If a cantor is observing required distance from the presider up front, they can sing. However, it is *not* appropriate at this time to encourage congregational singing for those in the pews. The Diocese has not been given the go ahead from the CDC or Health Department in the State to resume singing as of this time. When the State Health Authorities give us permission, we will have full participation.

Questions #2- Can we put the Missalettes back in the pew? The answer is No. Again, the State has not given the Church the go ahead yet, with the COVID precautions still in place. As soon as the Diocese tells me we can put them out, we will have them to use again.

Question #3- Can I resume the Anointing of the Sick? We have not celebrated this Sacrament for over a year. Again, with COVID Precautions in place, the Diocese said that we can do it. I will look for a date and time in June so we all can prepare to participate in this Sacrament. There is a need for this, and many have been asking. So, stay tuned and we will get the information out in the bulletin. With all the activities in May, with the fund raisers and rosary resuming for the month, I think we should wait to start it in June.

Thank you for being patient as we try to get back to some normalcy.
